Nazi Propaganda In U. S.

Pro-Nazi Allen Takes Press For A "Ride"

Washington, D. C.—Last week's developments in the sedition trial gave an excellent demonstration of the type of journalism practiced by some American newspapers.

Henry D. Allen of Pasadena, California, was on the witness stand. Allen is an ex-convict, an ex-Silver Shirt, the former liaison man between the German-American Bund and the Mexican Gold Shirts, and a rabble-rouser who frequently spoke at meetings of the Nazi Bund. For a while he was in the employ of individuals who worked very closely with an important German propaganda agency.

owner's attorney revealed that actually young Allen's eye was being treated by a physician long before the fracas in the haberdashery store and that the boy had sustained the injury while playing with a slingshot on a school playground.

Allen as a Performer

Allen has told his story of the alleged attack so often at meetings of the hate brigade and in the pro-Nazi press, that it is very doubtful that he was so overcome that he would faint.

His past performances give reason to believe that his collapse was staged, as well as the rush to his side by his screaming wife and daughters.

Though it knew the truth, the Los Angeles Examiner carried the INS story as filed in Washington. It did not bother to add a paragraph or two to put the story in its proper light, nor to inform other INS clients that the story as then carried on the ticker was malicious and completely misleading.

Tells Fantastic Story

Making the most of the opportunity to gain nation-wide publicity for his anti-Semitic convictions, Allen added the fantastic story that he "was moved from the west coast" to satisfy the "vengeance" of Jewish groups.

This story, too, was promptly given additional circulation through the facilities of the Hearst press while the facts could have been ascertained very easily by a responsible journalist through checking in newspaper morgues. There he would have found a United Press dispatch from San Francisco, dated November 4, 1942, reporting that Allen was ordered out of the Western Defense Zone by General John L. DeWitt because he was considered "dangerous or potentially dangerous to military safety."

Defendant Clark's Plot

One of the documents identified by Allen was written by defendant Frank W. Clark, who stated that he would come to California to meet with "all leaders of the militant branch of the National Liberty Party" and "give them a lecture on how to apply American militant tactics." He stated in his letter that "we will have to fight on towards the East every inch, until Americans regain their United States of America."

Defendant Clark's letter also indicated that through Allen he intended to take up contact with the Gold Shirts of Mexico and that he planned to work in close collaboration with the American Nationalist Confederation, an organization identified by the Government as headed by George E. Deatherage, another defendant in the mass sedition case.

In one part of his letter, Clark put his aims briefly and succinctly. He urged preparation "that we may do, when the showdown comes, just what General Franco has done in Spain."

These are the facts unreported in the general press. Honest reporting is at a premium. No wonder the influence of the press is waning.

Incriminating Letters

Six years ago, he was arrested in San Diego and authorities found in his possession many incriminating documents, among them outlines for military uprisings, a letter of introduction to former Bund-Fuehrer Fritz Kuhn, and correspondence with many leading Trojan Horsemen, living in all parts of the United States.

Some of these letters were identified by Allen while he testified as a government witness in the sedition trial. Yet very little of their contents were reported in the nation's newspapers.

The Hearst press, for instance, completely ignored that part of Allen's appearance which threw a glaring spotlight on the activities of our native Quislings. Instead it gave additional circulation to wild and unfounded stories, told by Allen and aimed to create anti-Semitism.

Hearst's own news agency, the International News Service, reported that "Allen collapsed on the witness stand while testifying to a beating which he said 'four Jews gave him and his 15-year-old son on the streets of Pasadena' in 1935."

"As Allen fell against the Judge's stand," the Hearst story went on to report, "his wife and two daughters ran screaming to his side."

Allen had just testified, according to the Hearst story, "We were brutally assaulted, knocked down and beaten. I was taken to the hospital. My 15-year-old son, his eye ruptured..."

Allen claimed that his son's eye was put out by the assailants and that his son tried twice to enlist in the armed forces but was rejected.

The Real Facts

The facts, however, were:

Allen and his son appeared in a haberdashery store in Pasadena, owned by a person of Jewish faith and attempted to return a shirt given to Allen's son as a Christmas present. The store owner's wife refused to make a refund because the shirt had been worn, whereupon Allen attempted to strike her, according to testimony given subsequently in the Pasadena Police Court. A clerk in the store attempted to prevent Allen from striking the woman and Allen fell through a show case and was injured. There was no evidence offered that the boy was injured.

Allen swore out a warrant for the arrest of the store owner, his wife and the clerk, all of whom were acquitted. Then Allen filed a suit for damages for injury allegedly suffered by his son, claiming serious damage to the boy's eye. Investigation made by the store
