<p>The lot shape is a rectangle with the shortest side facing the street. According to the Sanborn maps, the lot is about 37.5 feet wide on the street side and about 75 feet deep. The site has many features. The cement driveway is particularly peculiar in that it descends directly into the house basement where the garage is located. This driveway is held by a large cement retaining wall eventually reaching about six feet in height. The house is on a slight hill which is why the sidewalk leading up to the house has four steps. This sidewalk connects to the neighborhood cement sidewalk. There are two significantly old trees on the property which appear to be as old as the house itself: one in the backyard and one next to the front sidewalk. The house is setback about 25 feet from the street. To the east, there is about a 15 foot property setback, while to the west there is about a 25 foot setback. On the east side of the building, a 6 foot tall wooden plank fence extends to the property line from the façade of the house. On the west side of the building, a 3.5 foot fence extends to the other property line from the rear edge of the house.</p>
